





the church, as thousands of ethnic groups remained without a single Christian and with no access to Scripture in their language. Although progress has been made, currently 42% of the world's people groups (and comprising approx. 3,4 billion people) remain classified as "unreached by the gospel". The Congress urged the necessity of both evangelism and social justice in mission. Today the widespread embrace of holistic, or integral, mission can


