This month has been both busy and exciting as we were on mission in Botswana (31st May - 10th June), where the Lord really moved. We had the opportunity to minister in schools and to go about street ministry.



One of the highlights was the Mens Breakfast that was held on the Saturday.



The main point of discussion at the breakfast was to find out the reasons why men are not as involved in church activites as women; and to find out why there is generally such a small percentage of men attending church. The men seated at each table at the breakfast not only discussed the potential reasons for such behaviour, but also suggested possible ways in which to reach out to men in an attempt to address the matter.

We also held our Foxfire National Youth Camp, themed 'Set Apart', in partnership with Heartlines, Scripture Union and Alpha Youth. The program covered a range of topics such as:

- Mental Health
- Health and Fitness

STUDENT BECOMES TEACHER!

It is an incredible testimony that a former student of our social action project

"Thotho" from student to facilitator and motivational speaker.



(which 'Nyawonhle' empowers unemployed men with a skill in shoe repair) is now a facilitator of the project. Thobeka Justice Manqele ('Thotho' as he prefers to be called) was an excellent student of the February 2024 cohort (which was in Maqongqo) and is passionate about this skill he has learnt, having gone on to open a small business and now availing himself to teach others. Not only is he good with his hands, but is also a motivational speaker living with a disability. He says that being unemployed is no reason to 'be lazy and starve. One needs to use God given mind and hands to put a meal on the table.' Thotho has made us proud!

Nyawonhle makes its debut in Sweetwaters as the project commences there, with Thotho as facilitator to 20

learners.

Beyond the gathering and sharing a physical skill with the gents in Sweetwaters, we made it our duty to also share with them life skills and social skills, with spiritual encouragement. Our AE team intentionally shared our personal testimonies of our respective life-journeys before Christ, and our lives now, walking with Christ - making it clear that life without the hand of the Most-High God will surely be a life wasted. We addressed the importance of acquiring a skill, even with little things that might look worthless; and also the importance of people starting small business with the little that they can afford because no one will help a person who can't even try to help themselves and show that they are in fact trying.

Pastor Bandile David Ngubo (AE Evangelist) preached, and the students accepted Christ – a most beautiful thing to witness. Our prayer is that seed that was planted may grow in each and every one of them.

The 10-day course duration was over in a flash! The group was very happy with the end results and excited when the day of their graduation dawned. 'Some of them even went on to say that never before have they committed to something and saw it through to the end; and that they are grateful because amongst all that they have learnt, they have also learnt to start and finish on a high note.'


